



Consultation Contact List of Government Implementing Bodies - Updated October 2016

The purpose of this document is to provide Project Managers an updated list of government ministry contacts as you undertake consultations on amendments to your approved source protection plans. Due to staff changes over time, we ask *Project Managers and their communications staff to review your current email and mailing lists* related to source protection and *remove government ministry contacts that are not shown below*.

As of November 2015, all 22 source protection plans have been approved. Where technical work or other plan revisions are proceeding in accordance with the workplan agreements between conservation authorities and MOECC, project managers are reminded that plan (including assessment report) amendments are subject to section 34 of the Clean Water Act and sections 48 – 51 of O. Reg. 287/07. Your MOECC Liaison Officer can assist you with specific questions about these provisions.

When amendments may result in the addition of new policies or an extension of the geographical area that policies already contained in the plan apply, engagement with our ministry and others affected by the changes is required.

Development phase – Through your Liaison Officer, Source Protection Programs Branch is interested in being engaged while technical and policy work is in draft form in order to provide early feedback.

Pre-consultation with implementing bodies is required whether the same policies currently contained in your plan will apply in new areas, if new policies are being developed, or if the current policies are changing (i.e.: from prohibit to manage, or visa versa, or the policy tools change). Implementing bodies should be made aware of the changes and given an opportunity to provide feedback as early in the process as possible. Please be very clear in your communications with implementing bodies if the policies are the same/similar to those already contained in the approved plan, or if they are entirely new policies, and provide a summary of what has changed. Pre-consultation can take place early in the process and prior to the completion of the technical work. Also think about the most efficient approach to getting comments (i.e.: email, telephone discussion, meeting, etc.). The approach used does not need to mirror previous pre-consultations.

Public consultation – Include in your circulation list for public consultation the persons and bodies who would be affected by the technical work and plan revisions, including persons engaged in significant drinking water threats, municipal clerks, implementing bodies, Chiefs of First Nation bands if any part of a reserve is included in the source protection area that is affected by the changes, your Liaison Officer and our branch’s general inquiry email (source.protection@ontario.ca).

First Nations engagement should continue if you have a community in your source protection area. When you reach out for discussions and send notices to the Chiefs of First Nations, please also copy your Liaison officer and Neil Gervais, Group Leader at neil.gervais@ontario.ca.
