# Orono Municipal Well System Ganaraska Region Source Protection Area Policy Applicability Map





#### APPENDIX 5: SUMMARY OF CONSULTATION ACTIVITIES

The source protection planning process is open and public. The *Clean Water Act, 2006* and the *General* Regulation require that municipalities, First Nations, affected property owners, other stakeholders and the public have the opportunity to collaborate and provide input during the entire source protection planning process.

This appendix provides a summary of the consultation activities and timelines carried out by the source protection committee during the *Terms of Reference*, *Assessment Report*, and *Source Protection Plan* phases of this program. Source protection planning documents during each phase of consultation were made available through the website (<a href="www.trentsourceprotection.on.ca">www.trentsourceprotection.on.ca</a>), as well as at municipal offices and conservation authority offices (digital and hardcopy).

Each consultation phase also included notification to municipalities, stakeholders, and the public through newspaper advertisements, distribution of public notices, written correspondence to landowners, press releases, and website postings. In addition, conservation authorities conducted outreach activities through displays at trade shows, newsletters, special events, presentations to municipal councils and interest groups, as well as delivered education activities (*i.e.*, Ontario Drinking Water Stewardship Program) to increase awareness of the *Clean Water Act, 2006* and source protection planning.

#### TERMS OF REFERENCE (2008)

#### Consultation on *Draft* Proposed Terms of Reference

The *Draft* Proposed Terms of Reference for the Ganaraska Region Source Protection Area was made available for public input and comment for a 35-day consultation period from May 21, 2008 to June 25, 2008. Six public meetings were held from June 11 to 16, 2008 at different locations throughout the source protection region (Marmora, Trenton, Port Hope, Peterborough, Haliburton, and Lindsay).

#### **Consultation on the Proposed Terms of Reference**

A second 30-day comment period from August 12 to September 11, 2008 was conducted on the Proposed Terms of Reference.

#### ASSESSMENT REPORT (2009-2011, 2014)

#### **Pre-Consultation on Technical Findings**

Nine open houses were held in conjunction with source protection committee meetings between September 15 and December 17, 2009. The public were advised of these open houses through newspaper advertisements, distribution of notices to landowners and stakeholders, press releases, and the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region website.

#### Consultation on the Draft Proposed Ganaraska Assessment Report

The source protection committee posted the *Draft* Proposed Ganaraska Assessment Report for a 37-day comment period from June 2 to July 9, 2010. Six public meetings were held between June 23 and July 2, 2010 in communities throughout the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region (Baltimore, Norland, Havelock, Peterborough, and Stirling). Notification of consultation on the *Draft* Proposed Ganaraska Assessment Report included

correspondence to approximately 25 property owners inviting participation in the process and to provide updates on identified significant drinking water threats.

#### **Consultation on the Proposed Ganaraska Assessment Report**

A second consultation period lasting 30 days was held from September 10 to October 10, 2010 for stakeholders to provide comments on the Proposed Ganaraska Assessment Report.

#### **Consultation on the Revised Ganaraska Assessment Report**

During the preparation of the Proposed Ganaraska Assessment Report in 2010, tight deadlines required that some work be deferred until 2011. The remaining technical studies were completed early in 2011 and the document was amended and made available for public review and comment from May 4 to June 3, 2011. Based on comments received by the province and others, the Amended Proposed Ganaraska Assessment Report was updated and submitted to the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change for approval on June 28, 2011.

#### **Consultation on the Updated Ganaraska Assessment Report**

After approval of the Ganaraska Assessment Report in October 2011, further public consultation occurred between November 18 and December 20, 2013 regarding additional modeling that was undertaken which identified significant drinking water threats: marina gasoline storage tank ruptures (fuel spill) impacting the Cobourg and Newcastle surface water supplies; and wastewater treatment plant disinfection failures impacting the Cobourg, Newcastle, and Port Hope surface water supplies.

#### SOURCE PROTECTION PLAN (2011-PRESENT)

#### **Municipal Engagement**

Five municipal working groups, representing each of the five source protection authorities within the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region met throughout 2011 and early 2012 to review and provide input on policy concepts and *draft* source protection policies. Three municipal forums were held in Peterborough (December 2, 2010; June 8, 2011; September 20, 2011) for elected municipal officials and staff to receive updates on the source protection planning process, provide input on preliminary policy concepts, and discuss implementation issues.

#### **Notice of Plan Preparation**

All stakeholders, including all landowners identified as having significant drinking water threats on their property, were sent notification in May 2011 that the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Committee had begun the preparation of their source protection plans. Through this notification these property owners and stakeholders were invited to participate in the planning process.

#### **Pre-consultation**

The source protection committee consulted on the *draft* source protection policies with the parties that were identified as being responsible for implementation including municipalities, government agencies, conservation authorities/source protection authorities, and several industry associations. This consultation took place between September 2, 2011 and January 20, 2012. The correspondence provided to implementers included the *draft* wording of the proposed source protection policies, rationale for the policies, and an invitation to provide written feedback. To allow parties responsible for implementation with the opportunity to ask questions and seek clarification on the content of the *draft* source protection policies, meetings were held throughout this consultation period.

#### Consultation on Draft Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan

The source protection committee consulted on the *Draft* Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan for a 37-day comment period between March 19 and April 23, 2012. Six public meetings were held in communities throughout the source protection region (Baltimore, Minden, Lindsay, Havelock, Peterborough, and Codrington). The notification of consultation on the *Draft* Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan included written correspondence to approximately 15 significant drinking water threat property owners inviting participation in the process. In conjunction with the notification to landowners with significant drinking water threats, the source protection committee chose to also advise property owners with the potential to have significant drinking water threats in the future that the plan was available for consultation. Approximately 8500 landowners received hand delivered written correspondence from the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Committee prior to the public meetings held during the 37-day consultation period.

#### **Consultation on Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan**

Following the 37 day consultation period, the source protection committee considered feedback on the *Draft*Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan as a result of written comments received, and made changes to the document where warranted. The Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan was then submitted to the Ganaraska Region Source Protection Authority for final consultation with the public. The Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan was available to the public and implementing bodies for a 31 day consultation period which ran from June 27 through July 27, 2012. All written comments received by the source protection authorities during this consultation period were submitted with the Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan to the Minister of the Environment and Climate Change for consideration.

#### Consultation on Revisions to the Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan

Following submission of the plan to the Minister of the Environment and Climate Change, the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Committee received comments from the ministry regarding the policies in June and November 2013. An additional review of the policies was conducted by the source protection committee and municipal working groups. The source protection committee consulted on the resulting revisions during a 33-day comment period which took place between January 13 and February 14, 2014. All written comments received during this period were considered by the committee before the Proposed Ganaraska Source Protection Plan was resubmitted to the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change in March 2014.

Further comments on the Revised Source Protection Plans were provided by the Ministry of the Environment and Climate Change and Climate Change on June 26, 2014. Those comments were considered by the Source Protection Committee and resulted in a small number of changes to the policies and explanatory document. These changes included an amendment to the Ganaraska Assessment Report that made it so that a policy in the Ganaraska Source Protection Plan would apply to Enbridge Pipelines Inc., which was not previously affected. Consultation with Enbridge included a meeting with Enbridge staff and written correspondence.
