**15. FINAL GROUNDWATER VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT AND HIGHLY VULNERABILITY AQUIFER REPORT (AECOM)-**

**STAFF REPORT 08-09– GLENDA RODGERS**

By consensus, the Committee accepted the following staff recommendation:

*That the results of the vulnerability analysis completed by AECOM Canada Ltd. for the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region as presented in the Final Report, Groundwater Vulnerability Assessment – TCC Source Protection Region, December 4, 2009 and illustrated in the attached mapping prepared by AECOM be accepted by the Source Protection Committee for inclusion in the Trent Conservation Coalition draft proposed Assessment Reports.*

**16. FINAL ISSUES IDENTIFICATION FOR 14 GROUNDWATER SYSTEMS AND 10 SURFACE WATER SYSTEMS (XCG STUDIES)**

*That the findings of the XCG draft reports for the Trent Conservation Coalition Source Protection Region (Draft Report, ISSUES EVALUATION FOR FOURTEEN MUNICIPAL GROUNDWATER SOURCED DRINKING WATER SYSTEMS, December 2009, Table 59 and Draft Report ISSUES EVALUATION FOR TEN MUNICIPAL SURFACE WATER SOURCED DRINKING WATER SYSTEMS, November 2009, Table 43 be accepted by the Source Protection Committee for inclusion in the Trent Conservation Coalition draft proposed Assessment Reports and that E.coli and Microcystin-LR be considered issues for the Stirling and Bayside systems, respectively.*

**17. TRANSPORT PATHWAY – PETERBOROUGH - JANET NOYES, XCG**

In December, Richard Straka and XCG staff visited the area of concern – a small culvert upstream of the Peterborough municipal intake, which outlets into IPZ-1. It was noted that adding the transport pathway would not impact the vulnerability scoring.

## **19. ONTARIO DRINKING WATER STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM UPDATE – ANNE ANDERSON (LTC) (PRESENTATION)**

Anne Anderson provided an update on the ODWSP including both the 'Education and Outreach' activities and 'Early Action' funding for projects in the Source Protection Region. A total of \$332,948 has been received to provide financial assistance to property owners located within eligible areas. There are additional projects currently underway at an estimated cost of \$112,008.
